JBMSHP overview

The JBMSHP is a 6-week summer residential program for Arizona high school students who are typically underrepresented in the STEM fields.

Students are enrolled at ASU and take a mathematics course for college credit.

Important information

Housing requirement

Students are required to reside on the ASU
Tempe campus for the duration of the JBMSHP.

Attendance commitment

- The JBMSHP is a 6-week commitment, students are expected to attend all class sessions.
- Students are **NOT** permitted to miss any days to attend another summer experience/ conference/ camp.



Eligibility

- High school sophomore, junior or senior
- Cumulative 3.25 GPA (unweighted)
- "A" or "B" grades in high school math and science courses
- Minimum of 3 years of high school level math courses completed by May 2024.
- Seniors: accepted to ASU and plan to attend ASU during the fall 2024 semester
- Qualify for Arizona in-state tuition (based on Arizona Board of Regents guidelines)
- Must have lived in Arizona for at least 2 years





JBMSHP timeline

February 18, 2024 Student application deadline

February 20, 2024 Letter of recommendation deadline for recommenders

Early March Students notified of tentative acceptance

Mid-March Tentatively accepted students will take the required

ALEKS placement exam to determine final placement

Mid-April Students notified of final acceptance

June 2, 2024 First day of the JBMSHP

July 12, 2024 Final day of the JBMSHP


Tips to apply

- Read all of the instructions on the JBMSHP website PRIOR to starting your application.
- You must complete the entire application at one time (there is no "save for later" button).
- You will need parent/ guardian and household information. We recommend that your parent/ guardian be present to help you complete this section.
- Make sure you have your 1-page personal statement and unofficial high school transcript ready to upload to your application.



Important information

- 80 students will be selected to attend.
- You will receive an email confirmation once you submit your application online. You are able to modify your application afterwards if necessary.
- You can either apply online or submit a paper copy of the application.
- The application is available in both English and Spanish



Important information

- Incomplete or late applications will NOT be considered.
- Special consideration is given to students who are first-generation college-bound, typically underrepresented in STEM, and/or represent diverse backgrounds throughout the State of Arizona, including rural communities and Native Nations.
- Decisions of the selection committee are FINAL.
